#### **About This Project**



ALLEN EDWARD HARBAUGH, the "Mountain Poet" of Fayette County, Pennsylvania, created this unique record. He was a turn of the 20th century Renaissance man, genealogist, poet, journalist, sketch artist, sign painter, historian, economic development champion and political analyst. Allen lived in the village of Mill Run in the years before it became home to Fallingwater®, designed by Frank Lloyd Wright, the nation's most famous modern house. His

pen name was "Al-Ed-Ha," an abbreviation of his full name.

Beginning in the 1860s, when he learned the trade of printing and his word and math puzzles appeared in a children's magazine, Allen's name was known throughout the Fayette County coal region and at times beyond. His works were published in newspapers, books and magazines, and at his death, his obituary was published in Pittsburgh newspapers. As an artist and sign painter, "nobody was better known in the Connellsville region," eulogized one newspaper. "Buildings, barns, fences, rocks and signboards from Uniontown to Mount Pleasant bear evidence of his skill."

Allen's narrative history of his own Minerd ancestry, presented at that clan's inaugural reunion in 1913 at Ohiopyle, PA, has been an irreplaceable source of information that otherwise would be lost. In the century-plus since his death, while he has faded largely from public memory, his works at times resurface and have been published, a testament to the staying power of his creativity.

Allen used this notebook to keep detailed records on the branches of his and his wife's families. His self-taught calligraphy adds to its charm. The portfolio has been handed down to a fourth generation and will continue to be a treasured heirloom.

Since much of his art has been lost, it is our objective to reproduce this notebook for all to enjoy. We hope his records will inspire others to pursue their own research and lead to the discovery of other works.

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### →\*PREFACE.\*

HILE engaged in taking the United States Census of my District for 1880, I discovered that very few people were able to answer the questions pertaining to their Nativity, Parentage, etc. This lack of information was not attributable to a want of interest in these matters, but was owing to the absence of a suitable Family Record.

Seeing the necessity of a complete Family Record, wherein may be recorded the Names, Nativity, Date of Birth, Post Office, Occupation, etc., of ourselves and relatives, I have formulated this Record and now place it before the public, respectfully asking a careful examination of its contents. I firmly believe all fair-minded persons will agree with me that it does truly supply a "long felt want." This Record is arranged so that you and your descendants may readily trace your geneology. Who your relatives are, and what kinship may be seen at a glance.

Its great value in future years as evidence in Court, in establishing claims to property, and deciding who may be the legal heirs to certain estates, cannot be estimated. The older the book becomes the more it will increase in value.

The entries can be made at leisure, or as the information is obtained. The past, to some extent, is lost, but the future may be preserved, showing an unbroken chain of lineal descent for generations to come. A few suggestions in regard to filling out the Record may not be out of place here: Use good black ink, a good pen and a blotter. Do not soil the pages. If you are not a good penman get some one who is, to make the entries for you. The writing should be plain and legible, and the names should be correctly spelled. Write the matter on a separate paper, and after you are satisfied of its correctness, copy it in the Record. This Record may be kept by any person whether the head of a family or not.



## David Harbaugh, Somerset Pioneer

MILL RUN, Dec. 19.—David Harbaugh of near Scullton, Somerset ecunty, died December 13th, 1910, of heart dropsy, aged 79 years, two months and 16 days. He was the youngest of 12 children who have passed away, and his departure marks the extinction of one of the earliest pioneer families.

Casper Harbaugh, his paternal grandfather, at 21 years, was in General Braddock's defeat, and escaped death, and witnessed Braddock's burtal. He located in Somerset county where he lived until his 99th year. David, an uncle, built and operated the first wool-carding machine ever seen in Somerset county. The location was at Barronvale.

Of such progenitors, noted for skill, bravery and longevity, our subject was born Sept. 27, 1831. The son of Leonard and Martha Harbaugh—her maiden name was Miner.

David, on December 26th, 1852, was married to Miss Mary M. Whipkey, to which union 12 children were born, all of whom have arrived to mature years except one son, Ivens C., and a jumpiter, Mary.

During the Civil War he enlisted in Company D. Fifth Regiment, Pennsylvania Heavy Artillery, and served until close of the war. After his return

he cleared newly acquired land, and became a progressive farmer and stockraiser, and being a skilled mechanic in useful arts, he was successful. He lived an exemplary Christian life; was a member of the Methodist Episcopal Church since boyhood. During 53 years of happy married life, his children are noted for thrift, morality, temperance, virtue and patience. "Aunt 'Lena," their mother, now in her 78th year, is a model woman—the soul of kindness and gentlewomanliness.

Since last August, Mr. Harbaugh's health began to fail and dropsy of the heart resulted fatally, despite the most careful medical attention.

He is survived by an affectionate, sorrowing widow and ten children, namely: Albert F., of Arizona: Robert B., of Nicola: Amos W., of Barronvale; Mrs. Lucinda Younkin, of Clay Run; Mrs. Rosetta Miner, of Kingwood Mrs. Anna Weyant, of Unamis; Mrs. Mattie J. ## ALLEN HARBAUCH, POET AND SIGN PAINTER, IS DEAD

Allem E. Harbaugh, newspaper, man, poet, sign painter and cobbler, is dead. The end came yesterday morning at 5:30 o'c'ock at his home at Mill Run, after a short illness. He was 11 months and four days past his 66th year. Mr. Harbaugh had not been in good health for several months but his condition did not become serious until Friday morning. Death was due to a kidney affection.

As a sign mainter nobody was better known in the Connellsville region. Buildings, barns, fences, rocks and signboards from Uniontown to Mount Pleasant bear evidence of his skill. Sign painting was his means of livelihood for many years. In his younger days he led ned the coubling trade. Later he took up printing, getting an insight into that work on a Somerset weekly. Along with his other work the painter wrote verses. His short poems have from time to time been published in country papers. Some were accepted by magazines. Since age and failing health prevented him from following his usual work Mr. Harbaugh had devoted his time to writing. He had completed a half dezen or so poems which are stated today at Will Run.
