The name was carried back to its original meaning with its many changes according to what nation they were under or subject to. races and tribes migrated. They had no ~~names~~ ^{names} as are known today - sur and Christain names, but were designated according to their prowess, or their trade or persuits--as the batterer-ect.

The name means--" The Young King" who superceded the old conquered King.

The name originated ^{under} Charlemagne and under the Holy Roman Empire in the year A.D. 811 to 814. They later became Germac after the Roman empire was

laid waste by the Huns or Germac races. The Painting was executed by Mr John De Bolt of Decatur Indiana and all Younkin's should have one painted and hanging in his house. Mr DeBolt makes a small charge of \$30.00 for Gold leaf and \$25. for so-called Gold paint.

This Younkin tribe name is spelled various ways on account of different phonetic sounds as it was given when the name was asked and also when it was wrote down by others. The letter J in all germac languages is made like an English Y and that is the reason of the Y in our name.

an N before a G in Holland ~~is~~ ^{is} not, but not so in German, so the G was left off in most cases. Joungking is the proper way to spell the name. But is spelled 10 or 11 different ways.
